Liberty Apple <i>Malus 'Liberty'</i>	4-7	12-15'	10-15'	varies	dark green	2-5 years to bear; additional apple pollinator needed	Blooms mid-May; fruit ripens in Sept; hybrid apple cultivar developed by the New York State Agricultural Experiment Station; a prolific bearer that excels where McIntosh won't. Tree is low-maintenance due to its natural disease resistance to apple scab, cedar apple rust, fire blight, and powdery mildew; does not require fungicide spraying. Large fruit has a yellow background with attractive red overtones, a crisp white flesh, and a harmonious sweet-tart taste. Perfect for fresh-eating, drying, cooking, canning, or keeping – proper storage improves the flavor. Requires another apple pollinator.	\$17.00
Evans Bali Cherry <i>Prunus cerasus 'Evans Bali'</i>	3-8	15-20'	10-15'	upright shapely oval	dark green, turning orange in fall	fruit ripens in August; extremely hardy buds	This Canadian-developed sour pie-cherry has showy white flowers in spring followed by loads of deep, dark, one-inch, red cherries that are sweeter than most other sour cherry varieties, excellent for cooking & baking and making jams & jellies. This compact self-pollinating fruit tree is a great tree for the home garden or small orchard; attracts birds.	\$21.00
Prairie Expedition American Elm <i>Ulmus Americana 'Lewis &amp; Clark'</i>	3-9	55'	40-60'	rounded to spreading vase-like	dark green	yellow fall foliage	Incredibly tough and cold hardy, this American elm native selection is Dutch Elm Disease resistant with a medium to fast growth rate; prefers rich moist soils but is highly adaptable to different soil types; the original tree was a lone survivor among other American elm trees that died from DED; released and named in 2004 in honor of the 200th anniversary of the Lewis & Clark Expedition; provides quick shade in a variety of locations from cold prairies to harsh urban environments.	\$27.00

Northern Acclaim Honeylocust <i>Gleditsia triacanthos</i> <i>var. inermis</i> 'Harve'	3-6	35-45'	30-35'	symmetrical & upright becoming spreading with age	dark green	yellow fall foliage; drought tolerant; deer resistant	This cultivar was developed at NDSU where it outperformed other honeylocust cultivars in winter hardiness; thornless and seedless, it has a rather upright form similar to Skyline, and gradually widens with age. A sturdy, vigorous tree that is quite drought resistant.	\$23.00
Heritage Oak <i>Quercus x macdanielii</i> 'Clemons'	4-8	60-80'	40-50'	broadly pyramidal becoming oval	glossy dark green	yellow-brown fall foliage; drought tolerant	This vigorous cultivar, is a cross between Q. robur (English oak) and Q. macrocarpa (bur oak). It has glossy, dark green, tatter and mildew resistant foliage; is a beautiful specimen tree for the front lawn.	\$26.00
Deborah Maple <i>Acer platanoides</i> 'Deborah'	4-7	40-60'	40-60'	broadly oval	brilliant red spring foliage that turns dark bronze green	bronze yellow fall foliage	Discovered as a 'Schwedleri' seedling in Canada in 1967, it is similar to Schwedler but has a superior branching habit; a vigorous grower with a strong, straight central leader, it has brilliant red spring foliage that turns to dark green through the summer, then bronze yellow in fall.	\$30.00

Hinnomaki Red Gooseberry <i>Ribes 'Hinnomaki Red'</i>	4-6	3-5'	3-5'	rounded	dark green	red	Known for its large red fruit with outstanding flavor; a favorite of the home gardener.	\$7.00
First Editions Cool Splash Dwarf Bush Honeysuckle <i>Diervilla sessilifolia 'LPDC Podaras'</i>	4-7	2.5-4.5'	2.5-4.5'	compact, mounded, densely branched	variegated white & green	deer resistant; drought tolerant	The first variegated diervilla; its bright white stands out dramatically even in shady borders; bunches of yellow blossoms adorn the plant in June and July; easy to grow in a variety of soils; forms underground suckers, developing colonies over time; use in woodland settings or mass plantings for a spectacular effect.	\$10.00
Pawnee Buttes Western Sand Cherry <i>Prunus besseyi</i>	3-8	15-18'	4-6'	spreading	green	fragrant, drought tolerant; bright red & purple fall foliage	An introduction from the Colorado Plant Select program; the fragrant white flowers appear in April and produce a heavy crop of black cherries in summer attractive to wildlife; the lustrous, green leaves turn bright red & purple in autumn. Think of this plant as a groundcover form of native sand-cherry. Best in full sun to partial shade and tolerant of dry soils.	\$10.00

First Editions Crème Brulee Potentilla <i>Potentilla fruticose</i> 'Bailbrule'	2-6	3-3.5'	2-3'	upright, rounded	medium green	drought tolerant	Add a pop of white to the landscape with this new double flowering Potentilla bred at the Morden Research Centre in Manitoba, Canada; bright white flowers adorn this rounded shrub throughout the entire summer; dark green foliage contrasts beautifully with the flowers; tough and hardy to Zone	\$11.00
